Dr. Pie Habimana is a leading Kigali-based corporate attorney, governance strategist, and business leader with close to 20 years of high-level experience spanning academia, international arbitration, taxation, and corporate leadership. He also serves as Independent Non-Executive Director at Bank of Kigali Plc, Rwanda's largest financial institution, where he chairs the Board Nominations and Remunerations Committee. His leadership extends further as Chairman of Multisector Investment Group Plc and Non-Executive Director at MM&RJD Co. Ltd. His previous board roles include Cogebanque Plc, the Rwanda Bar Association, the East Africa Law Society (Vice-President), and Printerset Ltd.

A Senior Lecturer in Law at the University of Rwanda, he holds a PhD in International Tax Law from Leiden University (Netherlands).
